Group assignment #3 – Engineering presentation

This assignment will require your group to write a report on an engineering related topic and perform a formal group presentation. The topics you can choose from are:

- Engineering Internship. You can search for answers to the following questions and any other related questions you might consider interesting.
 - What are the opportunities for internship as advised in the Career Center at CPP?
 - o How many students at CPP have internships during college?
 - What are opportunities for internship from other resources?
 - What are the steps a student must take to get an internship?
- How to find an Engineering job after the graduation?
 - o Find information about job fairs at the Career Center.
 - o If possible, find the statistics about how many graduates of CPP find jobs after graduation, and how many of these jobs are Engineering jobs.
 - What are the steps of Engineering job hunting?
- Entrepreneurialism and Engineering Stories of success / how to become one
- Cutting edge developments in engineering / new technology
- Global Engineering issues How engineering is changing the world / Challenges
- Two three famous engineers / their accomplishments
- Three Five greatest achievements / inventions in engineering
- The history of your major with major accomplishments / inventions
- Three Five career choices / jobs of interest in your major
- Lifelong learning examples and why it's important
- Why engineers are important to society

You can also choose your own topic, but it must be approved.

Papers will be 4-5 pages (follow technical writing requirements: single spaced paragraphs and double space between paragraphs, no indentations) and will include a cover page and a list of references at the end.

Presentations will be formal: men should be wearing dress pants and dress shirt with a tie, no T-shirts / jeans / shorts / tennis shoes; women should wear either slacks or skirts (i.e. appropriate business attire).

The presentations should use power point, with a minimum of 7 slides (the first slide must contain the topic and all names of group members). Presentation time will be 10 minutes minimum / 15 minutes maximum. The time for the presentation will be included in the grade.

Presentations will be during lectures on June 3 and June 5, 2013. Papers are due on June 5, at the end of the lab, at 5:50pm.
