

Project proposal guidelines

Project proposal consists of the two parts: a written proposal and a Microsoft PowerPoint or OpenOffice Impress presentation. Initial project proposals are due on Wednesday, October 20, 2004, in class.

Written proposal:

- **Table of contents**
- **Introduction**
Objective. Motivation. Relevance. Assumptions. Area(s) of the compiler construction process you would like to spend more time on.
- **Background**
Related work. Proposal feasibility discussion. Existing software you intend to use.
- **Language design**
Items listed in the language design document. Items not directly applicable to a specific project can, of course, be omitted.
- **Language specification**
Items listed in the language specification document.
- **Language implementation**
Items listed in the language implementation document.
- **Project goals**
Carefully partition the project goals into deliverables and a wish list keeping the one quarter timeframe in mind.
- **References**
Related documents. Software you intend to use.
- **Project timeline**
Gantt chart, as discussed in the lab.

Presentation:

A summary of the most important or interesting points from the written proposal. Expect to talk for roughly 15 (30?) minutes.
